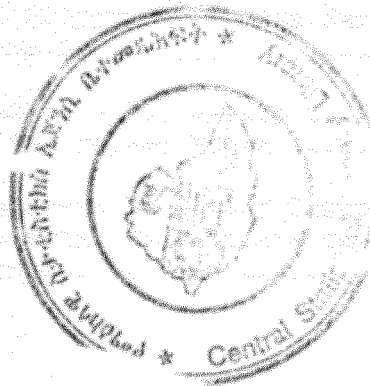

## Objective, Scope and Coverage

### Introduction:-

In August 1975 a committee composed of experts from various ministries and agencies felt the urgency of determining the pattern of living of households of industrial workers and civil servants. As a result of this need the survey was carried out among 2332 sample households in Addis Ababa, Asmara, Dire Dawa, Akaki, Massawa, Assab, Dubti, Wonji, Dilla, Setit Humera, Melka Werrera, Agaro, Bahir Dar, Ghimbi, Assela, Shashemene, Moyale, Negele, Yabello, Kobo, Awash, Mizan Teferi, Gambella, Itang, Assosa, Kebri Dahar, Dege Habur, Adi Galla, Teferi Ber and Afdem.

### Objectives:-

The survey was designed to meet certain specific objectives:-

- i) to examine the pattern of consumer behaviour and provide up-to-date and accurate weighting diagrams for the compilation of consumer price indexes;
- ii) to utilize the result of the Addis Ababa survey in the revision of the 1963 based Addis Ababa cost of Living Index;
- iii) to compare consumption expenditure per household per month for the towns included in the survey;
- iv) to supplement the sources of information used in compiling the official estimates of national expenditure in order to improve national income estimates;

### Scope:-

This household budget survey was carried out among national households living in industrial, agro-industrial, commercial and border areas of the country.

The survey was intended to study expenditure pattern and sources and amount of income of the households of sample employees.

## Subject Coverage:-

Information on certain demographic and general particulars, income and expenditure, other receipts and disbursements of each household and general information and retail prices of each town were collected by using three sets of questionnaires.

## Sampling units:-

In this survey, the sampling unit was the employee and the information was collected from each household of the selected employee. The definition of a household was taken from the Instruction Manual of Household Economic Survey (1972-73).

## Household:-

All persons, whether related or not, who normally live together in the same house or closely related premises, and who take food from the same kitchen are defined to constitute a household and such persons are called the members of the household. Single person households were also included in the survey.

## Survey Methodology

### Method of Selection:-

As mentioned earlier, this household budget survey was conducted in 30 towns of the country. From each town covered by the survey two institutions having the highest number of employees were selected at random. Then 60 employees were selected from a list of employees earning upto Birr 499 per month. If the number of employees in one or two of the selected institutions was less than 60, all of the employees were selected for the survey. In a similar manner a maximum of 15 employees were selected from each of the four high salary (above Birr 499 per month) paying institutions.

Special consideration was given to Addis Ababa and Asmara. The number of institutions selected from Addis Ababa and Asmara was 4 and 3, 8 and 6, for low and high salary earning employees, respectively.

## Reference Period and Method of Data Collection

In this survey the period taken for the field work was 77 days (Nehasse 3/1967 - Tekemit 13/1968). The reference period was one month for most of the items; for items such as durable goods the reference period was a year. The method of enquiry was employed to collect information from the households of selected employees. Using this method of data collection the household of the sample employee was contacted on one day. The data collected referred to July 1967 E.C. and for some households for Meskerem 1968 E.C.

### Limitations

In this survey, as previously stated, method of personal interviews was adopted to collect information from the selected households. Thus, the survey depended entirely on the memory of the households to obtain information on income and expenditure for the month proceeding the survey date. This introduced household memory errors as expenditures or incomes were not recorded as they arose. There was a tendency, therefore, on the part of the household to forget certain items. The opposite effect to under-reporting results sometimes forms "prestige bias". On the other hand, the respondent might have recalled some expenditures made before the time period of the study began.

The quality of the data collected could also be affected due to enumerators' bias (measurement and interview error). In addition, seasonal variation in income and expenditure was not taken into account as the survey referred to a particular month of the year.

### Analysis of Results

All in all five basic tables were analysed for each town by Tir 7, 1968 in accordance with the need of the committee which ordered the survey to be carried out. Four of these five tables were analysed by classifying the data according to the salary of sample employees. In order to meet the other main objectives of the survey the office had to re-analyse the result by classifying the data according to total salaries of the households of sample employees. This method of classification was followed in analysing the following twenty three tables for Addis Ababa.

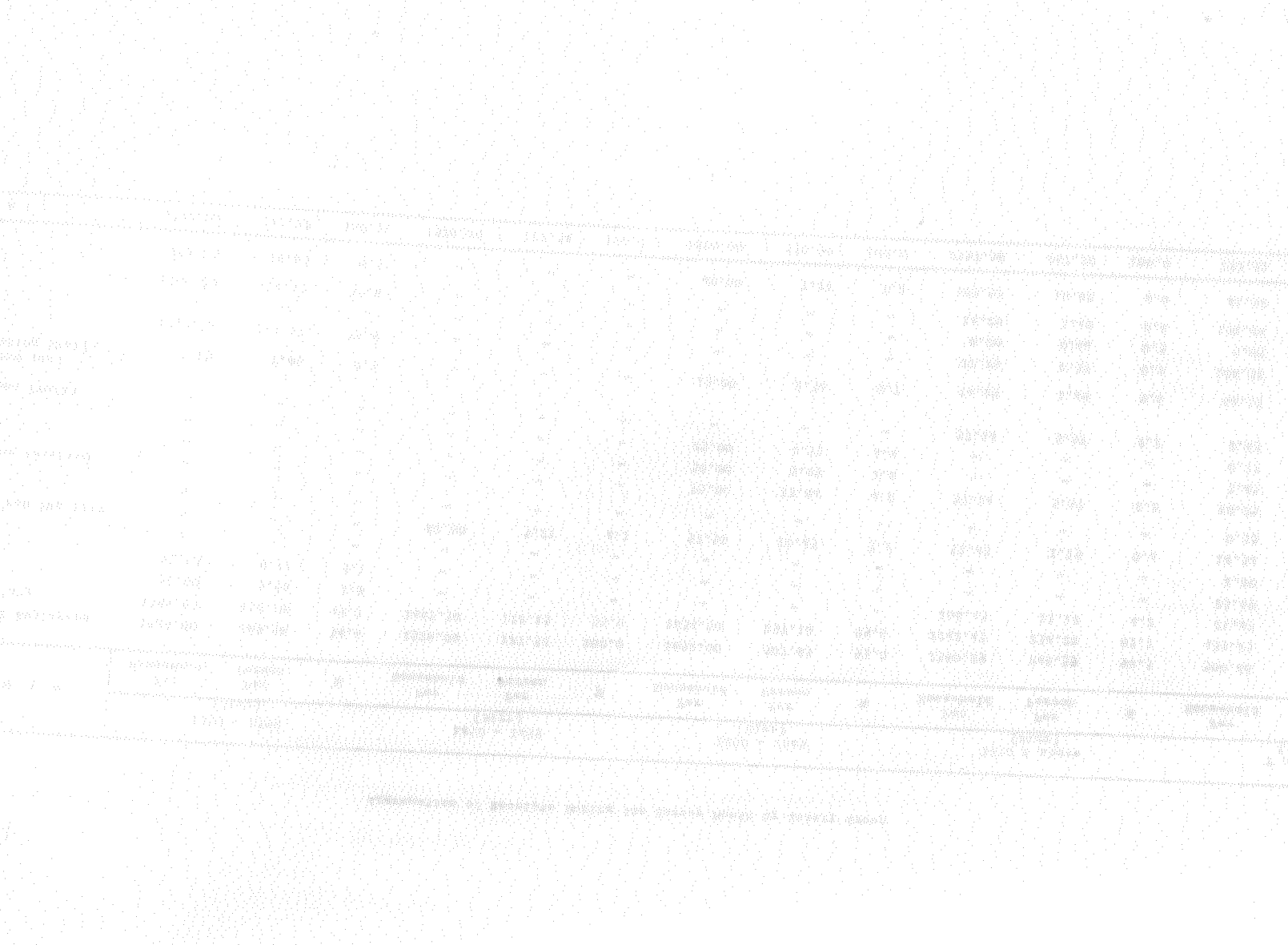

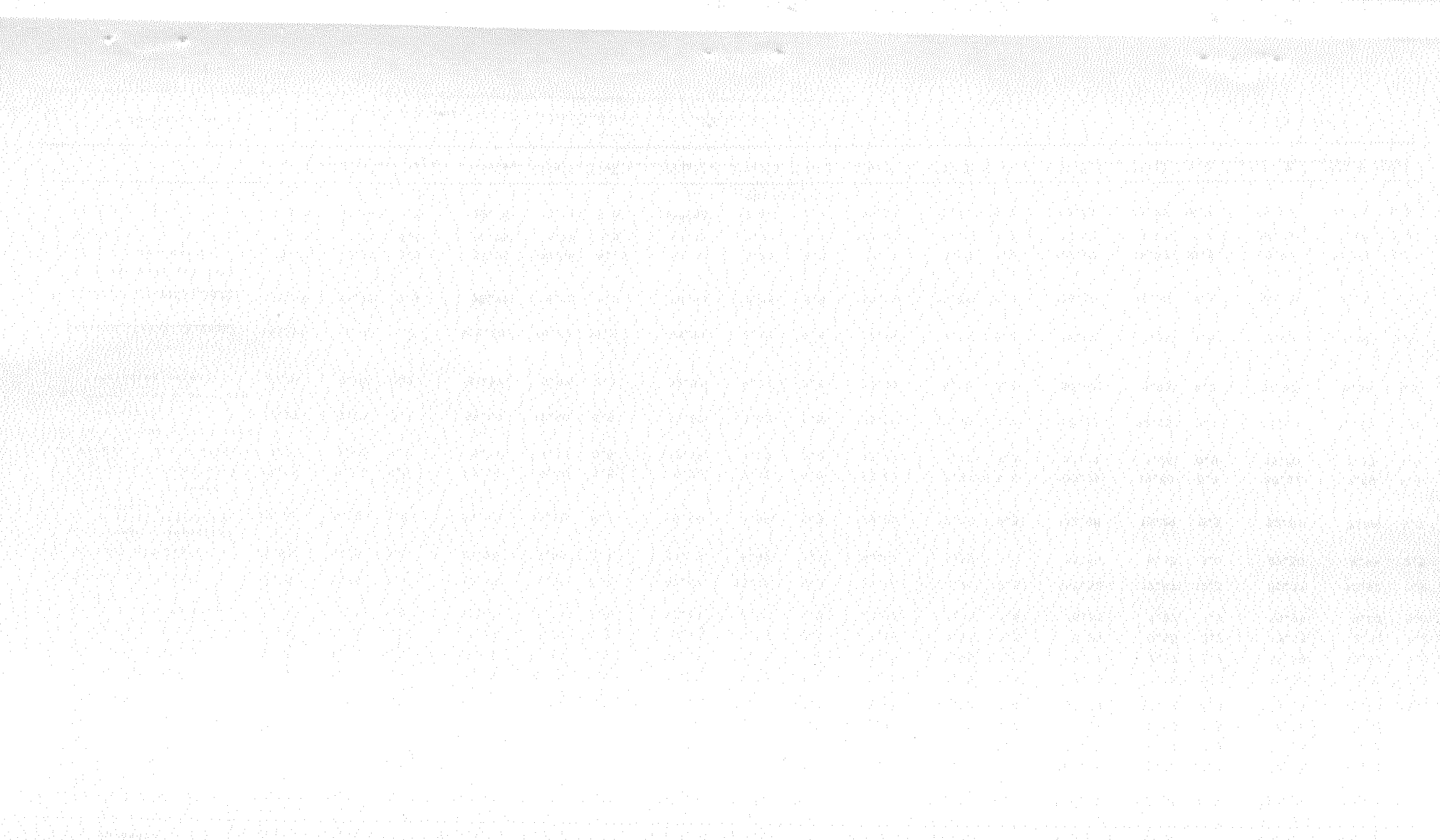

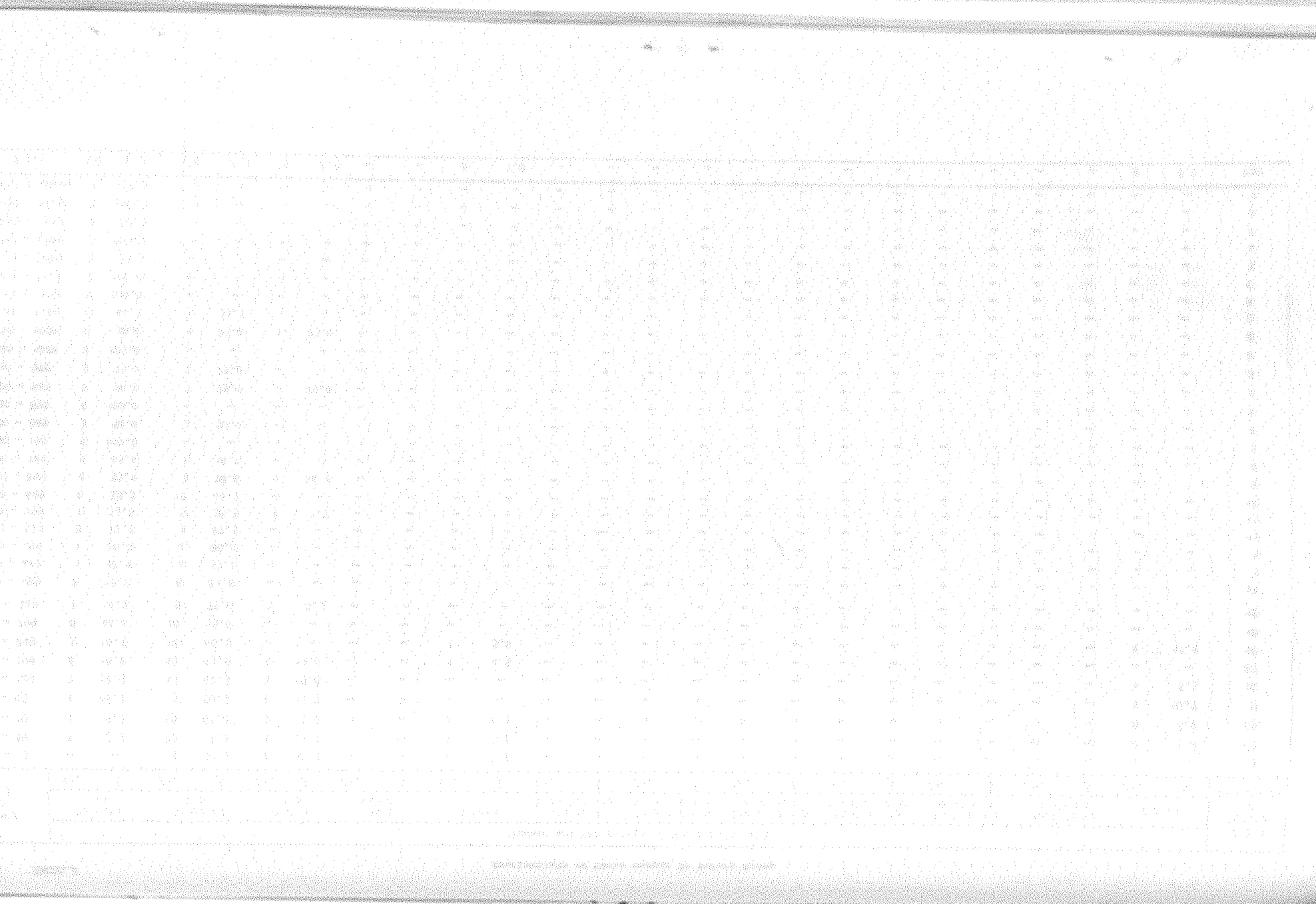
